1. Mentorship Program-1 (Paid)

What do we Offer?

- 1. One-on-one mentoring sessions with the mentor. The mentor will guide the mentee regarding monitoring, documentation, follow-up, and updates of past and ongoing cases of human rights violations. The Mentee will also get a chance to work with a mentor on report writing, translation, research work and project management.
- 2. Candidates will be trained on fact-finding techniques, case file management processes, and procedures to collect testimonies from conflict survivors and survivors of human rights violations,
- 3. Opportunities for building relevant and meaningful networking and connections,
- 4. Exposure to working experience with a team of highly skilled human rights lawyers,
- 5. Candidates will have the opportunity to participate in events and discussions pertaining to transitional justice and other human rights issues,
- 6. By the end of the program, the mentee will have developed a thorough understanding of transitional justice, impunity and other human rights issues.

Time period: 4 Months.

- 1. Candidate must possess a Bachelor's Degree (Human Rights and Law, Social Sciences) or be in their Final Year and be based in Kathmandu, Nepal.
